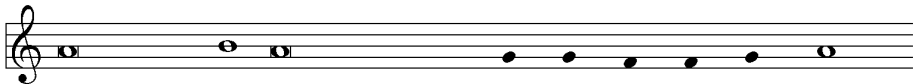

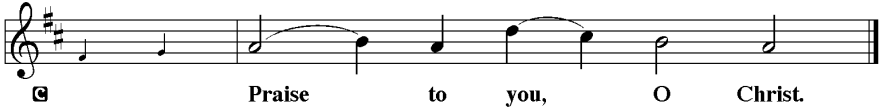



 to share with us the great and promised feast.

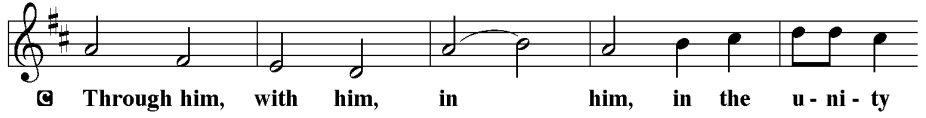

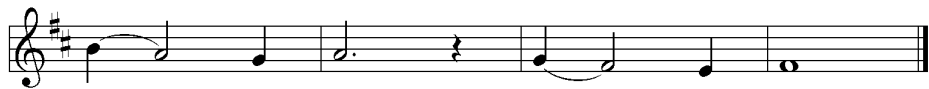
